

Concept Note

In order to achieve gender equality, it is necessary to overcome ingrained structural constraints that limit women's potential. Social change is sparked by women's political empowerment, which also speeds up national development. Women who are empowered are able to make independent decisions and actively contribute to the advancement of society. India has to keep creating a society that completely respects and supports women's rights, even though policies and initiatives have made great progress in recent years in empowering women. This seminar will examine the changing role of women as future architects of India, highlighting the significance of government, civil society and individual efforts working together to build a healthier and more equitable society.

Objectives of the Seminar
