Carl Jung & MBTI

- Carl Jung has described many archetypes dimensions of personality namely the animus/anima, the shadow and the self.
- The animus is the masculine side of the female and anima is the feminine side of male and the role of this archetype is to guide us towards a perfect mate.
- The shadow is the negative or the dark side of our personality also known as the devil.
- The self-archetype is the unifying part of all of us that finds balance in our lives.
- Carl Jung is most known for the theory behind the well-known MBTI instrument.
- Based on Jung's basic elements of human psyche, a mother daughter team (Katherin Briggs & Isabel Briggs Myers) developed a 100-item instrument popularly known as MBTI.
- MBTI stands for Myers-Briggs Type Indicator widely used instrument for personality analysis.
- 16 personality types are generated by the instrument and are based on combination of four basic elements of psyche.

Source of Energy

- Introverts (I): are motivated by what's on the inside and prefer self-reflection, dreaming and vision.
- Extroverts (E): are outgoing, speaks then thinks, relate more easily to the outer world of people and things than the inner world of ideas.

Collecting Information

- Sensing (S): Practical, concrete, would work with known facts than look for possibilities and relationships.
- Intuiting (N): Theoretical, abstract, would look for possibilities and relationships.

Decision Making

- Thinking (T): Analytical (head), relies more on interpersonal analysis and logic than on personal values.
- Feeling (F): Subjective (heart), relies more on personal values than on interpersonal analysis and logic.

Understanding the World

- Judging (J): Structured, organized, likes a planned and orderly way of life rather than flexible and spontaneous way.
- Perceiving (P): Flexible, spontaneous, likes a flexible, spontaneous way rather than a planned and orderly way of life.
