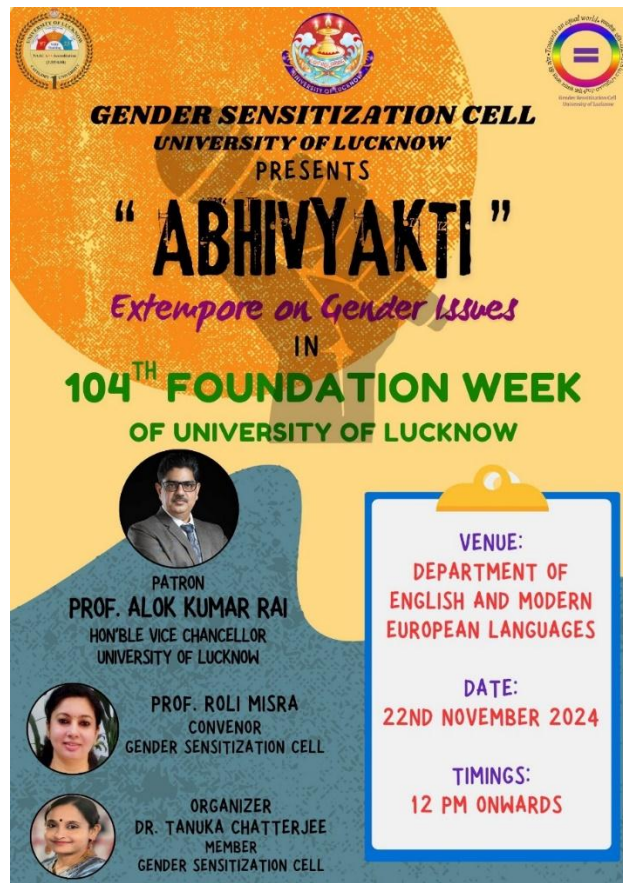


Report on
