
REPORT-LECTURE ON "ROLE OF ATAL BIHARI VAJPAYEE AS A LEADER OF OPPOSITION IN INDIAN POLITICS"

On December 21, 2024 a lecture titled "Role of Atal Bihari Vajpayee as a Leader of Opposition in Indian Politics" was held at the Department of Public Administration, University of Lucknow. The Lecture was organized by the Counseling and Guidance Cell in collaboration with Atal Sushasan Peeth, University of Lucknow aiming to provide insights into the leadership qualities of one of India's most revered political figures. The event was honored by the presence Prof. Narendra Kumar from Centre of Political Studies, School of Social Sciences, JNU, as the guest speaker.



The primary objective of the lecture was to examine Atal Bihari Vajpayee's role as the Leader of Opposition and his influence on shaping Indian democracy. The event aimed to equip the participants with a deeper understanding of his leadership style, political strategies, and the impact of his opposition leadership in the Indian political landscape. By analyzing his
