

# No legal bar: HC rejects plea for Kejriwal's removal as Delhi CM

**NEW DELHI:** The Delhi high court on Thursday dismissed a petition seeking Arvind Kejriwal's removal as chief minister from his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate (ED), saying it failed to show any legal bar against his continuation in the post. It added that, if any "constitutional failure" exists due to the arrest of a sitting chief minister, it is for the President to act on it rather than the court.

"As the executive branch examines it, wherever they have to do, they will do. We should not be getting into this political thicket," said a bench headed by acting chief justice Manmohan Mathur dismissing a public interest litigation (PIL) filed by Surjit Singh Yadav, a social activist.

Yadav sought Kejriwal's removal from the post of chief minister following his arrest by ED on March 21 over his alleged involvement in the now-scrapped 2012 water cess policy. A civil court on Thursday allowed ED to retain the CM's custody till April 1.

"If there is a constitutional failure, the President will act on it or the lieutenant gover-

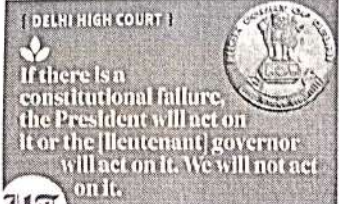
nor will act on it. We will not act on it. Article 230A (Proviso) in case of failure of constitutional machinery) is not to be exercised by the high court. It is to be exercised by the Governor. Government will exercise power to remove the President. Whether it (government) will function or not function, that is something we can't consider," said the bench, which also comprised Justice Manmoh Prasad Singh Arora.

## Obstruction of law, argues petition

Yadav's petition said that the chief minister, while being in jail, was incapable of transacting any business that the law enjoins upon him. It added that any material, irrespective of its secretive nature, would have to be scanned thoroughly by the prison authorities before it reaches the hands of Kejriwal.

Yadav also submitted that the continuation of Kejriwal as Delhi's chief minister would lead to the obstruction of due process of law, and disrupt the course of justice, which will then result in the breakdown of constitutional machinery in the state.

The plea sought a response from the Centre, the Delhi gov-



ernment, and the principal secretary to the lieutenant governor (LG) to answer the petition for examination and that is being done. The bench told the petitioner that the situation is being examined by LG VK Saxena and that the executive may take some time to arrive at a conclusion.

"We have read today's newspaper. LG is examining this issue. It will go to the President for examination and that is up to them. That belongs to a different wing. They'll take their time and arrive at a conclusion. It may take some time. Probably this situation was not envisaged, whatever it was,"

the bench said.

**No legal basis, says HC**  
The court underscored that Yadav failed to cite any legal basis that prevented Kejriwal from continuing as CM, and that it only pointed to the practical difficulties that could be incurred by the latter while running the government from prison.

"There may be difficulties, we accept all those. There may be practical difficulties but the question is, is there any legal bar? Any prohibition. You show us any legal bar, you are pointing out practical difficulties and Article 230A is not something that we will con-

sider. That the LG has to consider, the President of India has to consider, the council of ministers have to consider. Why should we pass [an order]?" the court remarked.

## 'No scope for judicial interference'

The order passed by the high court later said: "Having heard the counsel for the petitioner, this court is of the view that there is no scope for judicial interference as a vis the relief for removal of Respondent No 4 (Arvind Kejriwal) from the post of chief minister. It is for the other wings of the government to examine in accordance with law. This court clarifies that it has not commented on the merits of the case."

Kejriwal was arrested on March 21 by ED after the Delhi high court denied his request for interim protection from arrest.

Hours after his arrest, Delhi Cabinet minister Atishi had said that Kejriwal would continue as the chief minister and run the city government as usual, if needed. Since then, Kejriwal has issued two "orders" to his ministers from the federal agency's custody— one on water supply and the other on mohalla clinics.

# Tejas Mk-A makes its maiden flight in B'loru

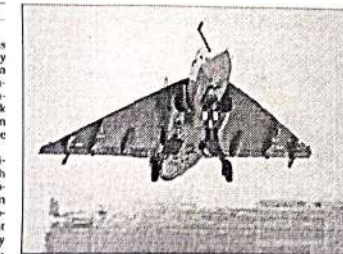
**NEW DELHI:** The first Tejas Mk-IA aircraft on Thursday made its maiden flight from a Hindustan Aeronautics Limited (HAL) facility in Bengaluru and the country can look forward to its early induction into the Indian Air Force, the state-run plane maker said.

"HAL achieved this significant production milestone with concurrent design and development, amid major supply chain challenges in the global geopolitical environment subsequent to the contract in February 2021." HAL chief CB Ananthakrishnan said.

HAL's chief test pilot Group Captain KK Venugopal (ret'd) flew the light combat aircraft (LCA) Mk-IA for 18 minutes. IAF ordered 83 Mk-IA fighters for ₹48,000 crore in February 2021, and plans to buy 97 more Mk-IA's at a cost of around ₹ 67,000 crore. The first aircraft was to be delivered by March 2022 but there is some delay as some key certifications are still pending, as first reported by HT on March 25.

HAL, thanked the defence ministry, IAF, the Aeronautical Development Agency, the Centre for Military Airworthiness and Certification, and other agencies that have contributed to the programme. "With the continued support of these stakeholders, the country can look forward to early induction of the Tejas Mk-IA by IAF and more numbers through the three lines of production established at HAL," the company said in a statement.

IAF is expected to operate around 350 LCAs (Mk-1A and Mk-2 versions), with a third of those already ordered, some inducted, and the rest flying prominently on the air force's modernisation roadmap and expected to be contracted in the coming years. In October 2023, HAL handed over the first trainer version of LCA Mk-IA to IAF chief Air Chief Marshal VR Chaudhary in Bengaluru, with the twin-seater set to fly a key training role and double as a fighter if needed. ## two LCA squadrons.

The remaining eight aircraft are all trainers and are likely to be delivered to IAF soon. One of the 32 LCA Mk-1s inducted crashed near Jaisalmer on March 12, minutes after taking part in a tri-services exercise that sought to demonstrate the straddles India has made towards self-reliance in the defence manufacturing sector. In November 2022, Modi flew in the LCA Mk-1 in Bengaluru and described the experience as "incredibly enriching" while also heaping praise on the country's indigenous military capabilities. IAF will deploy light combat aircraft at forward air bases in the western sector to bolster its combat readiness against Pakistan and fill the gap left by the gradual phasing out of the Soviet era MiG-21 fighter jets.

Timely delivery is a top priority for IAF, which is grappling with a shortage of fighter squadrons. The gap left by the flight is yet another landmark in the LCA programme, said Air Marshal Anil Chopra (ret'd), director general, Centre for Air Power Studies. "IAF needs the Mk-1A fighters urgently. HAL needs to accelerate production for timely deliveries," he said.

# Guj court sentences Sanjiv Bhatt to 20 yrs in jail

**AHMEDABAD:** A sessions court in Gujarat's Patanpur on Thursday sentenced former Indian Police Service officer Sanjiv Bhatt to 20 years' imprisonment in connection with a 1996 drug seizure case, a day after the same court pronounced him guilty of falsely implicating a lawyer in the matter nearly three decades ago.

Bhatt is currently serving a life term in a 1980 custodial death case and has latest sentence in an additional 20 years behind bars in what is known as a consequent prison sentence.

Second additional sessions

judge Justice Jatin Thakker, who convicted Bhatt in the case on March 27, also fined him ₹2 lakh, stipulating that a failure to pay the penalty would add a year to his sentence.

In a 740-page order, Justice Thakker sentenced Bhatt under a string of sections of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act and the Indian Penal Code.

The case concerns the 1996 arrest of a lawyer from Rajasthan during Bhatt's tenure as the police chief of Baranambha district after officers allegedly uncovered drugs in the former's hotel room.

However, the court ruled that Bhatt fabricated evidence, planting

police allegedly abducted him from his home in Patan.

The Gujarat high court ordered an investigation in the case, prompting the arrest of Bhatt and his subordinate TB Vyas in September 2018.

Vyas subsequently became an approver in the matter. Bhatt was dismissed from the services in 2015. It is noted that Bhatt was handed separate jail terms under each offence in the drug-planting case; the court ruled that these will run concurrently and to a maximum of 20 years.

ent of police in Gujarat's Jamnagar. Bhatt obtained over 30 individuals under the Terrorist and Disruptive Activities (Prevention) Act (TADA) after his arrest.

Following their release, one detainee, Prabhudas Vaidhyanath, died, with his family accusing Bhatt of custodial torture. They made a raft of allegations, including that he was beaten, sexually abused, and denied water, resulting in kidney damage. Bhatt and others, however, were booked in 1995. He was convicted and sentenced to life imprisonment for a case concerning a 1980 custodial death.

# CBI closes 7-year old graft case against Patel

**NEW DELHI:** The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) has closed a seven-year-old corruption case against Nationalist Congress Party leader Praful Patel, officials said in a statement on Thursday.

The allegations pertained to Patel's stint as the civil aviation minister in the Union Progressive Alliance government when Shiv Sena broke away from the coalition in 2007 and 2008.

Patel, who is now part of the Aam Aadmi Party, was accused of impropriety in approving the decision since the airline had been receiving its own new jet from 2007. The agency, which opened an investigation in 2017, filed a closure report to a court on March 19 saying it did not find sufficient evidence against Patel, an official said, asking not to be named.

Patel is now part of the NCP group that is in coalition with the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) and the Shiv Sena in Maharashtra, where both his party faction and

chief minister Eknath Shinde's Shiv Sena broke away from the Maharashtra Vikas Aghadi (MVA) — consisting of them being the BJP's rivals to allies.

CBI's decision comes on the heels of what several opposition politicians have alleged to be a political design by Prime Minister Narendra Modi's party to pursue rival politicians with federal agencies, but drop the cases if they switch allegiances.

A person close to Praful Patel welcomed the closure report and said: "Everything that happened in his tenure cannot be attributed to him." # Gurdwara Kar Sewa chief killed in U'khand, CM Dhama sets up SIT

**DEHRADUN/HALDWANI:** Nanakshahi Gurdwara Kar Sewa chief Baba Tarset Singh was allegedly shot dead by two unidentified men on the shrine premises in Ukhanda on Thursday morning, police said.

Chief minister Pushkar Singh Dhami said a special investigation team (SIT) has been formed to probe the case. He also asked DGP Abhinav Kumar to take stern action against the culprits.

According to the police, the incident took place around 6:15am when the two accused

opened fire at Singh using a rifle. "Between 6:15am and 6:30am (on Thursday), Baba Tarset Singh was sitting on a chair at the main gate of the Dera (a resting place for souls) when the men, wearing turbans, arrived... on a motorcycle and fired two shots at him using a rifle before fleeing the spot. He was rushed to a hospital in Khatima, where he was declared dead," Ukhanda Singh Nagar SSP Manojnath TC said.

"In the CCTV footage, the accused can be seen. Both were Sikhs. Eight teams have been formed to nab them," he added. The SSP said initial probe revealed that the two accused stayed at the gurdwara from March 19 to 27.

"We cannot clearly say about the motive till the accused are

Dhami said the DGP has been directed to take "prompt and strict action against the culprits." SIT has been formed to investigate this incident. Strict instructions have been given to top police officers to arrest these murderers," he said.

DGP Kumar said, "The killing is a matter of concern for us. We have reached out to central agencies to see if they can provide any information," he said. The process of registering an FIR was underway at the time of filing this report.

Ranjit Singh, former minister of Nanakshahi Gurdwara Prabhanda Committee that oversees the affairs of gurdwara, said, "The Dera chief has been killed over rivalry. Some people belonging to a Sikh organisation
